

## Risk Management Committee / Review of Injuries

Dates Reviewed: February 6, 2020 to April 30, 2020

<b>Injury Type</b>	Contusion to head
<b>Description of Accident</b>	Employee had started to loosen the upper clamp on a pipe of a truck to relieve the pressure. The process was not completed. Another employee went to remove the pipe to replace sealing gaskets. The pipe still had pressure on it. When the lower clamp was loose enough, the pipe moved and caused either the wrench or pipe to hit the employee in the side of the head.
<b>Corrective Measures</b>	Make sure pressure is relieved on the pipe.
<b>Injury Type</b>	Injury to knee
<b>Description of Accident</b>	While getting down off from the truck, employee felt a pop in the knee.
<b>Corrective Measures</b>	Always make sure three points of contact are being used. Watch footing when stepping off on to the ground to make sure there are no holes.
<b>Injury Type</b>	Burn to face and hand
<b>Description of Accident</b>	Employee was heating up a seized clevis pin with a small handheld torch. There was grease surrounding the pin area. The grease caught fire and employee blew the flames out. The grease fell on the face and hands burning through the gloves and landing on the nose.
<b>Corrective Measures</b>	Clean off grease before starting the job. Watch the placement under the truck (bus). Employee could have placed themselves so they would not be in the path of any grease falling. Employee should have worked from the front of the axle to the side of the area. Employee should have had water to put out any fire.
<b>Injury Type</b>	Strain to right ankle
<b>Description of Accident</b>	Employee was parking an Ottawa Switcher in the parking lot that had rusted steps. Employee was informed of bad steps prior to working on unit. Upon investigation, it appears as though employee had jumped down from the switcher and foot was caught.
<b>Corrective Measures</b>	Make sure you follow instructions. Always use three points of contact and do not jump from an elevated surface.
