

## Risk Management Committee / Review of Injuries

Dates Reviewed: June 4, 2020 to June 29, 2020

<b>Injury Type</b>	Eye Injury
<b>Description of Accident</b>	Employee was cutting a clutch brake off from an installed transmission. A piece of debris fell into the eye. Employee flushed eye, but felt the debris a couple days later.
<b>Corrective Measures</b>	Goggles or face shield could have been used to prevent debris from falling. It is strongly recommended employees wear goggles or face shields while working under vehicles.
<b>Injury Type</b>	Back Strain
<b>Description of Accident</b>	Employee was reaching over right steer tire toward back of engine to access the fuel filter. The employee felt a pull in his back and arm.
<b>Corrective Measures</b>	Employee could have tried to prevent the awkward position. Employee could have tried the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Turn the tires to gain better access</li><li>• Remove the inner fender</li></ul> Employees should always look for ways to prevent awkward positions.
